It allowed them the ability to make healthy social life decisions. They were able to find meaning in their current life and not have to escape by using substances. they were comfortable in their own skin, (a phrase you may have heard of).

We then sought to help other teens find their passion and purpose. As they found their personal passion and purpose, we observed this calmed down the risky choices of weekend behaviors. Teens who had once been using marijuana and alcohol to cope with life, reduced usage and

eventually stopped as they instead spent time volunteering in an area that they wanted to work in one day. Their dream became more inviting than the substance using social scene, where kids were numbing themselves and not finding ways to cope with everyday life.

What is the seed that's been planted in you, that was planted in you when you were younger? What was the dream you had of what you would become, of what you could do one day?
